- Current programme will have to be assessed and evaluated.

#### **Building Report:** (Tabled)

- Gas heater in main playing room has been fixed. The problem wasn't as grave as we thought.
- Pongas in the garden are potentially weakened and could fall as did two trees during the last storm.
  Lalith will organise that they are removed
- Next capital item three suggestions were:
  - ladies' toilets not scoped or assessed as yet
  - curtains and upholstery and
  - replacement of overhead lights.
- **Soft furnishings:** Anne and Helen have done a lot of work investigating reupholstering the chairs and new curtains and quotes have been submitted. \$12,000 will be applied for as a TSB grant. Thank you to Anne and Helen.

- Member participation also presented. A small percentage of players play a disproportionate number of Bridge sessions.
