Code Of Conduct

The New Plymouth Contract Bridge Club (NPCBC) aims to promote the enjoyment and development of bridge for players of all levels. To achieve this outcome we expect members to be courteous and respectful to their partner, opponents, the director, contractors, service providers and volunteers at all times.

This Code outlines the standards of behaviour that the NPBC expects from all members, contractors and visitors. It confirms our commitment to building a club environment free of any form of inappropriate or unacceptable behaviour.

A breach of this Code of Conduct may lead to disciplinary action, up to and including the cancellation of club membership, termination of your contract or engagement with us, or if a visitor, exclusion from the club facility. If we consider the breach to be of a criminal nature, we may report the matter to the police.

Our Requirements

All members, contractors and visitors are expected to abide by the following conduct:

Members, contractors, and visitors shall not engage in inappropriate or unacceptable behaviour.

The rules and etiquette of bridge as outlined by the World Bridge Federation and the New Zealand Bridge Association are always followed. This includes comments or gestures that may convey information to your partner or disturb the opponents during the bidding or play, and unfair or unethical methods to gain an advantage over the opponents, such as cheating, colluding, or using unauthorised signals or conventions.

The director is called promptly and politely whenever there is an irregularity or a dispute at the table. Do not argue with the director or question their ruling. Should a player disagree with a Director's decision the player has the right to appeal but play at the table must continue according to the Director's decision.

Harsh criticisms or comments on matters of bridge bidding & play shall not be made to your partner or opponents.
